#### The Tuskegee Airmen Exhibit Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow

The Tuskegee Airmen Exhibit, recently moved to the Scott Exhibit Hangar, portrays the historic challenges and proud record of the all-black flying unit of World War II. The new and enhanced exhibit features a large dramatic mural background depicting the Moton Field Alabama flightline in 1942, a large-screen TV showing Tuskegee Airmen interviews and a BT-13 Valiant trainer like the ones used at Tuskegee. A display case also includes information on Major General Joseph A. McNeil, the pioneering pilot after which the local Tuskegee Airmen Chapter is named. The images of yesterday and the work of the Joseph A. McNeil today serve to inspire tomorrow's generation to aim high and overcome obstacles to reach personal dreams of achievement.

#### About Andrew Jackson Young

Former U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations, Andrew Young is an American politician, diplomat, activist and pastor from Georgia. He served as Mayor of Atlanta from 1981 to 1989 and was instrumental in bringing the 1996 Olympics to Atlanta. He served as a Congressman from Georgia's 5th district. In 1981, Young received the nation's highest civilian award, the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Since leaving political office in 1989, Young has founded or served in a large number of organizations. He has written seven books including the 9-volume History of the Civil Rights Movement in 1990.
