Welcome

Once a visitor has entered the museum proper, all public areas are accessible, unless otherwise notated.

Eating Areas

The Museum of Aviation does not offer onsite meal accommodations. The Jet Fuel Java & Aviation Gift Shop is handicap and wheelchair accessible and offers snacks and drinks. Pavilions are available on a first-come first-serve basis unless otherwise notated. —Museum of Aviation, Warner Robins, GA.

Stores

The Jet Fuel Java & Aviation Gift Shop is located on the first floor in the Eagle Building and is wheelchair & handicap accessible.

Restrooms

Accessible restrooms are located in the Eagle Building on the first and third floors, and are wheelchair & handicap accessible.

The public restrooms on the first floor in the Century of Flight building are also handicap and wheelchair accessible. The Private classroom restrooms located in the Fabulous Flight Classroom on the 2nd floor of the Century of Flight Hangar are also wheelchair & handicap accessible.

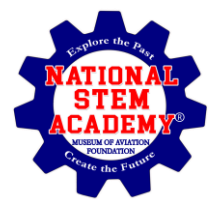
There are handicap and wheelchair accessible restrooms located in Hangars 1 & 3 also, as well as outside in the picnic area.

Telephones

Every building has a public TTY telephone available at each volunteer desk, and volunteers are on staff to assist. -Museum of Aviation, RAFB

Water Fountains

Accessible fountains are located throughout the Museum in restroom areas. —Museum of Aviation, RAFB

Parking

Free parking is available for visitors with handicapped parking identification in all three public parking lots.

Entrances

All buildings and hangar main entrances are accessible and have handicap automated push button doors.

Getting Around the Museum

General Statement

All of our historic buildings have wheelchair-accessible entrances; interior access varies. The paths and walkways to all buildings are cemented and easily accessed by a wheelchair. Most roads are level, with steeper grades located near the Century of Flight Hangar and Hangar 3. —Museum of Aviation, RAFB

Floor Plans

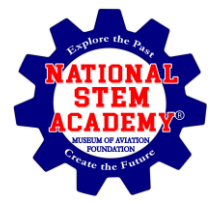
Maps of the Museum and any special event dates and times can be found at any volunteer station in all four buildings.

Wheelchairs

The museum makes every effort to have enough wheelchairs available. Although it is not possible to reserve a wheelchair for a given time, you will find wheelchairs stored in the Eagle Building, ask a volunteer for assistance. Use of Museum wheelchairs is a free service. —Museum of Aviation, RAFB
