The Museum of Aviation staff and volunteers are dedicated to increasing the enjoyment of all visitors. Please feel free to ask for assistance from anyone wearing a red vest or a name badge.

Once a visitor has entered the Museum of Aviation grounds, all public areas are accessible, unless otherwise notated.

General Information

Stores

The Jet Fuel Java & Aviation Gift Shop is located on the first floor in the Eagle Building and is wheelchair and handicap accessible.

Restrooms

Accessible restrooms are located in the Eagle Building on the first and third floors, and are wheelchair and handicap accessible.

The public restrooms on the first floor in the Century of Flight building are also handicap and wheelchair accessible. The Private classroom restrooms located on the 2nd floor of the Century of Flight Hangar in the National STEM Academy, are also wheelchair and handicap accessible.

There are handicap and wheelchair accessible restrooms located in Hangars 1 & 3 also, as well as outside in Freedom Park.

Telephones

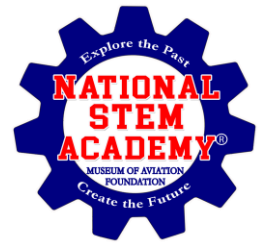
Every building has a public TTY (Telecommunication Device for the Deaf) telephone available at each volunteer desk, and volunteers are on staff to assist.

Water Fountains

Accessible water fountains are located throughout the Museum of Aviation in restroom areas.

Eating Areas

The Museum of Aviation does not offer onsite meal accommodations. The Jet Fuel Java & Aviation Gift Shop is handicap and wheelchair accessible and offers snacks and drinks. Pavilions are available on a first-come first-serve basis unless otherwise notated.



Getting to the Museum

Parking

Free parking is available for visitors with handicap parking identification in all three public parking lots.

Entrances

Most buildings and hangar main entrances are accessible and have handicap automated push button doors.

Getting Around the Museum

General Statement

All of our buildings have wheelchair-accessible entrances; interior access varies. The paths and walkways to all buildings are cemented and easily accessed by a wheelchair. Most roads are level, with steeper grades located near the Century of Flight Hangar and Hangar 3.

Floor Plans

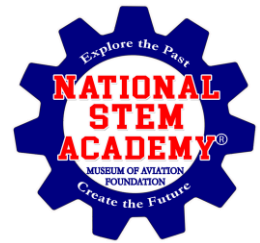
Maps of the Museum of Aviation and any special event dates and times can be found at any volunteer station in all four buildings.

Wheelchairs

The Museum of Aviation makes every effort to have several wheelchairs available. Although it is not possible to reserve a wheelchair for a given time, you will find wheelchairs stored in the Eagle Building and the Century of Flight Hangar. Ask a volunteer for assistance. Use of Museum of Aviation wheelchairs is a free service.

Service Animals

Service animals are welcome. The Museum of Aviation follows the Department of Justice regulations implementing the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) for title II and title III entities. Arranging Special Tours & STEM and History Field Trips

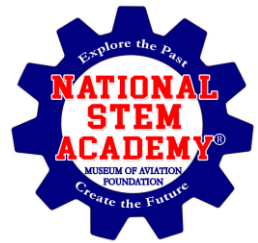
